Dear Mr. Hakala:

Thank you for your response to the letter I sent you September 8, 2011 concerning wider partially paved shoulders on Highway 26 from Woodford to Meaford.

As a follow up to your discussion with Amy McGuire and after further consideration of the alternative routes available to cyclists, I wish to inform you that the ministry has decided to construct a 1.0m wide partially paved shoulder on Highway 26 from 300m east of St. Vincent / Sydenham Townline easterly to the 12<sup>th</sup> Line. This will provide the same width as Highway 6 south of Tobermory.

Again, thank you for bringing your concerns to our attention.
